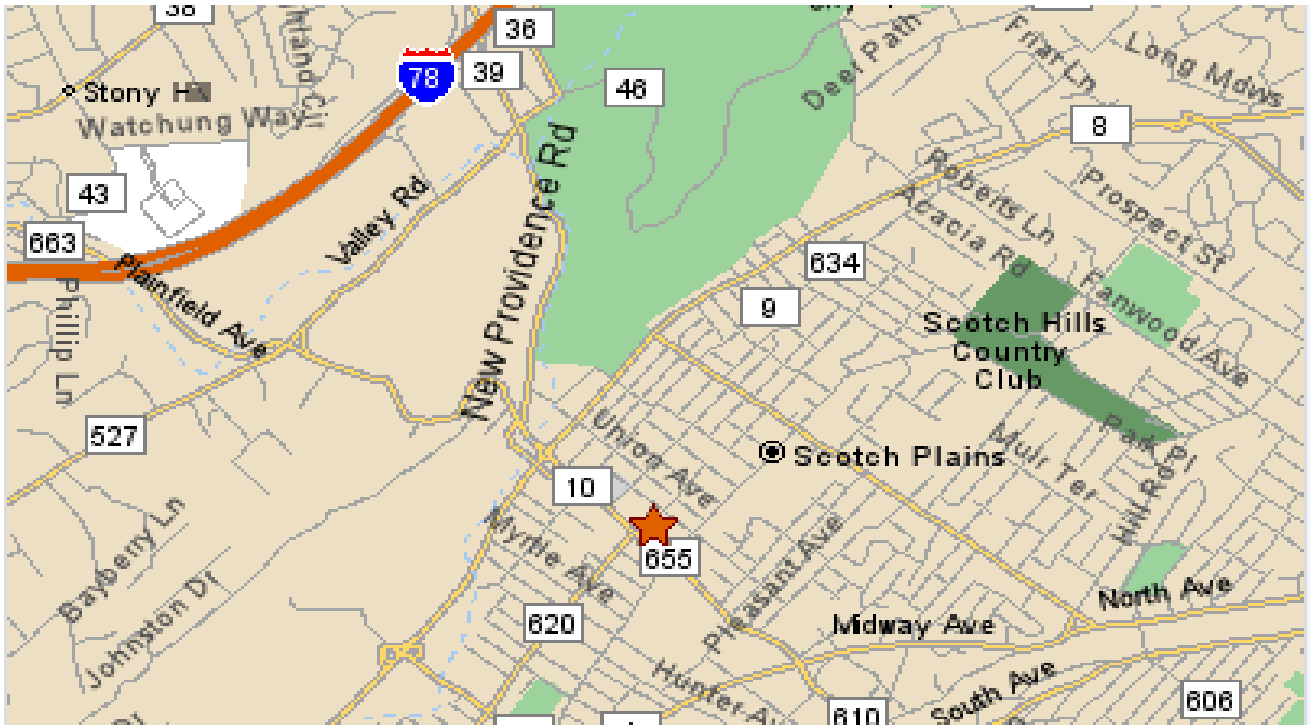


SCOTCH PLAINS RESCUE SQUAD from Garden State Parkway

Getting to the Scotch Plains Rescue Squad building can be quite a challenge, mostly because the folks in that area don't believe in marking the street names on many of the roads outside the main part of town!

So I have recorded my instructions, perhaps it will help some others find the place more easily. **1916 Bartle Ave, Scotch Plains, NJ**

From the Garden State Parkway, take the INTERSTATE 78 West to exit 41



You will exit to the right and curl around and come to a cross street;

Make a Right at the cross street and go down a hill to a T intersection;

Make a Right at the T intersection and go down another steep hill;

You will come to a traffic light at a major intersection with VALLEY ROAD;

Continue forward across Valley Road intersection and you will be on BONNIE BURN ROAD (Rte. 641-S);

Go down another long steep winding hill (!);

At the bottom of the hill is a traffic light and intersection with PARK AVENUE;

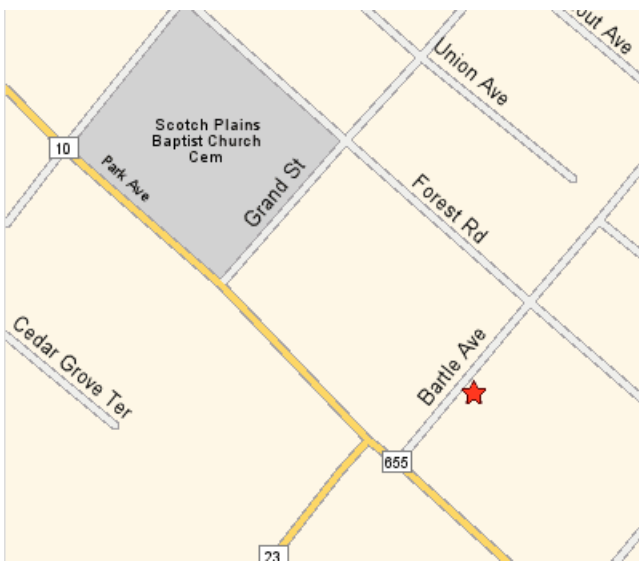


Go Right on Park Avenue, and continue over Route 22;

Stay in the Right lane, but don't go into the shopping center driveway;
come to a "sort of a T" intersection at stop sign;

Make a Right at the T
and pass thru traffic light at MOUNTAIN AVENUE (cross street);

Go past GRAND STREET on the left, then FRONT STREET on the right
and a short ways further the NEXT LEFT is Bartle Avenue (opposite public park
area on right).



The Rescue Squad building is just a short ways in from Park Avenue, on the right.

There is a driveway on the right just before the Rescue Squad Building (alongside the building)

DO NOT PARK IN THE AREA NEXT TO THE BUILDING – continue to the main parking area

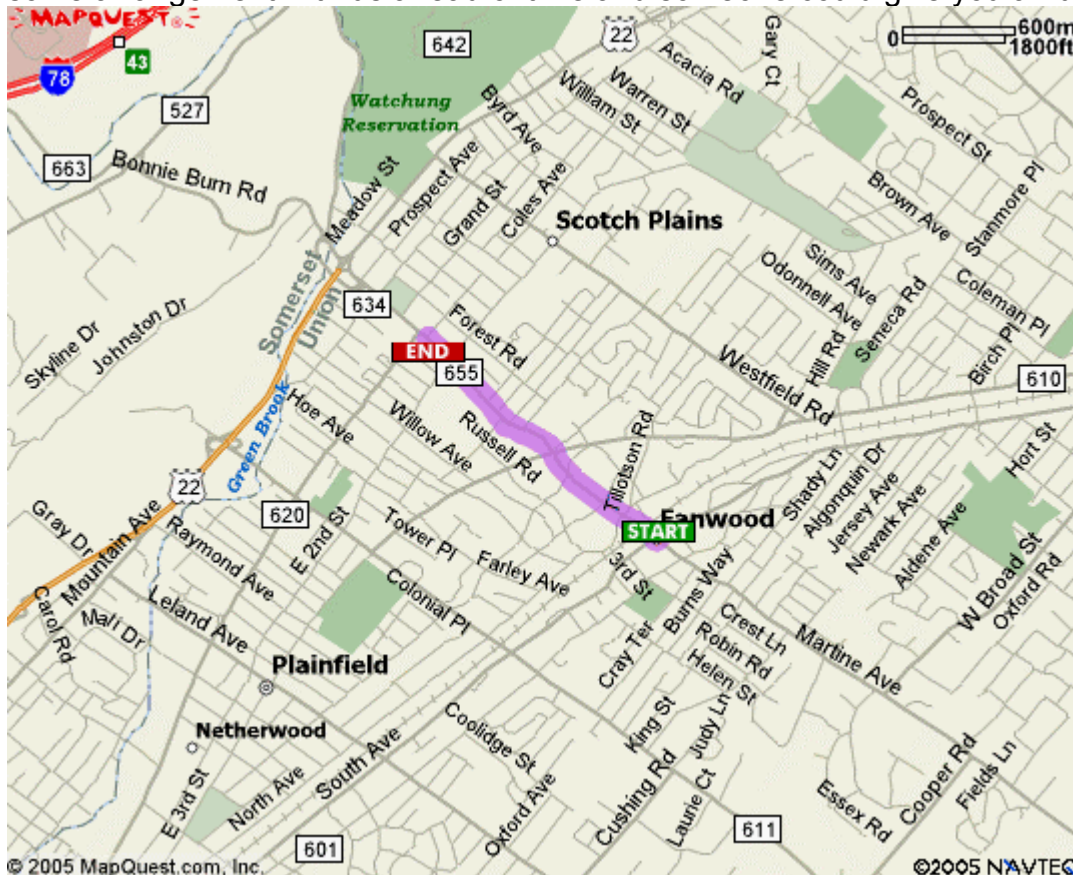
(if you park next to the building, reserved for the ambulance crews, you will be TOWED AWAY)

Walk from the parking lot area back toward Bartle Avenue and the front of the building; use the entrance door at the near front corner of the building, and go upstairs to the meeting area.

===== NJ Transit railroad travel =====

You could also come to the meeting via NJ Transit from NYC or anywhere in New Jersey (almost!) The nearest station is on the Raritan Valley Line.

You would come to the FANWOOD NJ railroad station. From there, it is about one mile to the Rescue Squad building – easily walk-able on a nice day, or make some arrangement with us ahead of time and someone could give you a ride.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

Personal Items Keep aisle ways clear of obstructions at all times. Store larger items in the overhead racks or under the seats.

Pets Only service animals accompanying customers with disabilities or their trainers, police dogs and small pets in carry-on travel cages are allowed on-board NJ TRANSIT trains.

Smoking Smoking is not allowed on any trains, in any stations, or on any platforms.

Electronic Devices and Cell Phones Listen or speak at a volume that does not disturb other passengers.

Bicycles and In-Line Skates You can bring collapsible bicycles on all trains at all times. Standard frame bicycles are permitted in accessible cars only except aboard weekday peak period trains or on major holidays. NJ TRANSIT conductors may use their judgment, based on crowding and capacity, to make exceptions. Note that a customer with a disability is given priority over a customer with a bicycle. Bicycle storage is available at most stations. While bicycle racks are free, please call 973-491-7587 for locker rental information. You can carry in-line skates (rollerblades), but you can't wear them on-board trains.

WE'RE ACCESSIBLE AT MANY STATIONS

Stations with the above symbol are accessible to customers using mobility assist devices. For assistance on or off the train, please inform the train crew. Customers traveling from Hoboken, please arrive 15 minutes before your scheduled train departure and notify an NJ TRANSIT representative for assistance.

SAFETY FIRST

Boarding or Detrain Watch the gap between the platform and train. In rain or snow, use extra caution. Always stand behind the safety line while waiting for your train. Never get on or off a moving train.

Crossing Tracks Permitted only at designated locations. Never go around the lowered gates at a grade crossing.

Please Stay Alert Many of our trains arrive noiselessly. Don't go near overhead electrified lines.

In An Emergency Listen for announcements. In case of smoke or fire, go to an adjoining car and evacuate through the nearest exit as instructed.

Purchasing Tickets tickets your way

ON-BOARD TRAINS

Train personnel can accept cash only (no bills over \$20). A \$5 surcharge is applied if ticket vending machines (TVMs) were available or ticket offices were open at the time of boarding.

AT TICKET OFFICES/TVMs

Purchase your ticket before boarding trains when a ticket agent and/or a TVM is available. TVMs accept credit cards, debit cards and cash (no bills over \$20). If you have a personal check or Transit Benefits, please go to a ticket agent or a major terminal. NJ TRANSIT 10-trip tickets and student monthly passes are not available from TVMs. PATH 11-, 20- and 40-trip QuickCards are available from all TVMs.

ONLINE

Quik-Tik is the easy way to buy your monthly pass. Quik-Tik accepts major credit cards and Transit Benefits. To apply, visit our website at www.njtransit.com. Customers without web access can call 1-866-QUIK TIK for an application.

ALSO KEEP IN MIND

Extending Your Journey If you extend your trip, you must pay the one-way fare between the destination on your ticket/pass and your final destination.

Changing Your Terminal A flat fee of \$3.25 will be charged on-board trains when you present a ticket/pass printed with Newark Penn Station or Hoboken Terminal for travel to New York or to/via Secaucus.

Traveling to Newark Liberty International Airport Monthly rail passes and one-way tickets with the airport as the destination include an access fee of \$5.50 and are encoded to allow passage through the fare gates at the station. Please be sure to retain your ticket for passage through the fare gates. Other tickets/passes (including tickets purchased on-board trains) require that you purchase an additional ticket at the airport station TVMs for fare gate passage. Children 11 and under are not required to pay the access fee.

Commuter Tax Benefit Programs Make commuting easy on your wallet by saving up to \$105 per month and \$400 per year. Employers save too. Call 973-491-7600.

TRAVEL FLEXIBILITY

You can use your NJ TRANSIT rail pass on light rail or bus! Rail passes are imprinted with a **bus-zone** number. You can use that rail pass for any light rail trip, or for bus trips up to the number of zones indicated on the pass simply by presenting it to the bus operator or light rail fare enforcement officer. Because our lowest priced monthly rail passes cost less than a bus or light rail monthly pass, they are not eligible. Rail tickets purchased for transfer between the Hoboken and Newark division rail lines "via Secaucus" will be valid for use on the Newark Light Rail at no additional cost for connections between Newark Broad Street and Newark Penn stations only, with a single ticket. Rail one-way, ORT and 10-trip tickets are not valid on other light rail or bus.

FARE OPTIONS saving you time and money

We want to make your travel convenient and economical, so we offer lots of options:

Monthly Passes Unlimited trips within a calendar month; can be purchased beginning the 20th of the month prior and are valid until noon on the first commuting weekday of the following month.

Weekly Passes Unlimited trips from 12:01 a.m. Saturday to 6:00 a.m. on the following Saturday.

10-Trip Tickets Ten one-way trips.

One-Way Tickets One continuous trip.

Off-Peak Roundtrip Tickets (ORT) One-way travel in the direction indicated on the ticket. Not valid for AM peak travel to/via, or PM peak travel from/via New York, Secaucus, Newark or Hoboken.

One-Way Reduced Tickets One-way travel valid for senior citizens, passengers with disabilities, and children.

Senior Citizens (62 and Older) and Passengers with Disabilities can travel on-board NJ TRANSIT at a reduced fare of half the regular one-way fare or less at all times. Seniors may be asked to present valid ID (any ID or document with printed date-of-birth and issued by a government, social service or mass transportation agency). Also valid: the MTA Reduced Fare Card; PA Senior Citizen Transit ID or PACE Card; PATH Senior Fare Card; or Medicare Card. Passengers with disabilities must present an NJ TRANSIT Reduced Fare ID or Medicare Card. Call 973-378-6401 for more information.

Children's Fares Small kids, small fares: ages 5-11 save at least 50% on regular one-way fares; 4 and under (up to three children) ride free with a passenger paying any valid fare.

Family SuperSaver Fares Family-friendly NJ TRANSIT allows two children ages 5-11 to ride free with a passenger paying any valid fare from 7pm Friday (or day before a holiday) to 6am Monday (or day after a holiday).

Student Monthly Passes A good reason to stay in school. Ask a ticket agent for details.

Group Rates Travel cheaper together. Call 201-714-2880 for Group Sales.

Making connections easy

Newark Light Rail NJ TRANSIT riders can get great connections to Newark Light Rail. Service is convenient and frequent, with easy transfers from train service at Broad Street Station and Newark Penn Station. Service between Newark Broad and Newark Penn stations operates every 10 minutes during the peak period, every 15 minutes during middays and evening, and now every 15 minutes on weekends. Take advantage of stops in downtown Newark at the NJPAC, Atlantic Street, Riverfront Stadium, and Washington Park. From Newark Penn Station, frequent service is available to suburban Newark, Belleville, and Bloomfield. See a Newark Light Rail timetable for details..

Secaucus Junction connects 10 of NJ TRANSIT's 11 commuter rail lines. On the upper level you'll find the Northeast Corridor, North Jersey Coast Line and MidTOWN DIRECT service (on the Morris & Essex and Montclair-Boonton lines) to and from New York. On the lower level are the Main, Bergen County, Port Jervis and Pascack Valley lines. You can transfer between the upper and lower levels using magnetically encoded tickets to pass through fare gates, please be sure to retain your ticket for passage. You can transfer directly between train lines on the same level.

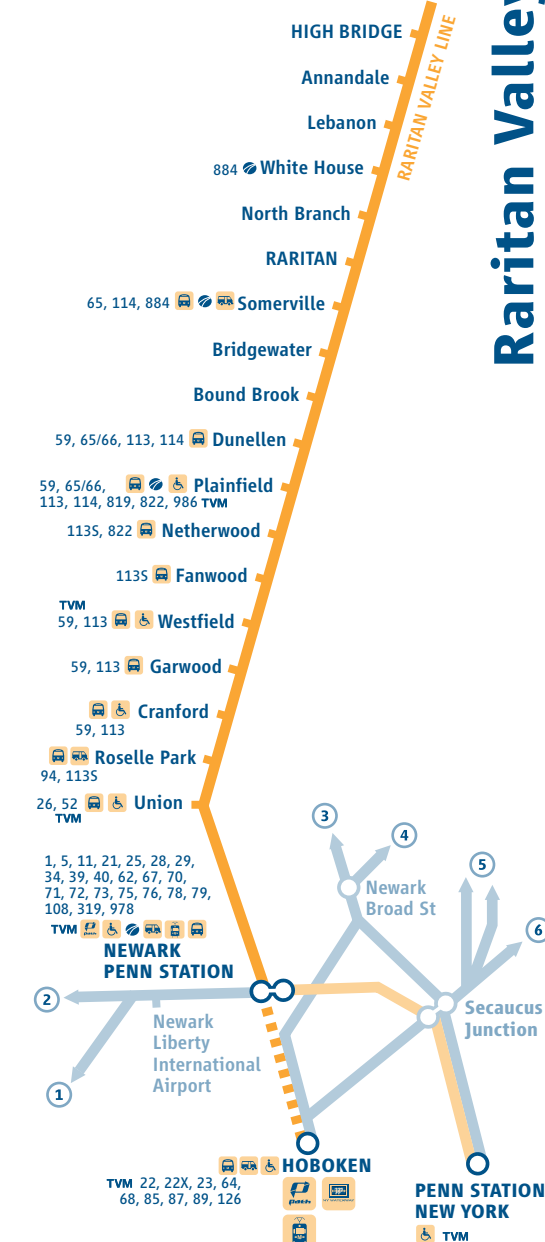
Refunds One-way and off-peak round-trip tickets are not refundable. Weekly and monthly passes and unused/partially used 10-trip tickets should be mailed to the address below. Passes mailed in after they become valid will have two full one-way fares deducted per business day. Ticket agents will issue a full cash refund for wholly unused 10-trip tickets purchased with cash. If a TVM malfunctions, it will give you an adjustment receipt. Mail it or present it to a ticket agent. If you paid cash, you'll get cash on the spot. If you don't get a receipt, report the problem to a ticket agent or the Refund Department.
